SPAIN WORLD POSITION IN THE AGRO-FOOD EXTERNAL TRADE, 2013

The value of Spanish exports of agro-food1 products in 2013 reached 39,774 million euro, with a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 9.1% since 2009. In 2013, Spain occupied the 8th position between the main world exporters of these products.

The agro-food external trade balance of Spain recorded 8,252 million euro in 2013, up from 1,476 million euro in 2009, reaching the 14th position in the world.

The 10 main exported agrofood products of Spain (42% of total) such us citric fruits, wine, pork meat, olive oil or fresh vegetables have had a CAGR of 7.1% between 2009 and 2013 This fact has had a positive effect on the behaviour of Spanish agricultural trade balance in the recent years.

(1) Agro-food products include agriculture, livestock and fisheries, as well as industry processed.

2. EMPLOYMENT. The employment in the primary sector rose by 9.4% in the IV Q 2014, although it remained 6.2% below 2013 level. In the agro-food industry, the employment decreased by 1.5%, but it continued to be 7.8% higher than in 2013. The number of people affiliated to the Social Security system increased by 3,903 persons in the primary sector in 2014, and by 7,068 persons in the agro-food industry.

3. PRICES. Prices received by farmers fell by 5.1% from 2014 (January to September, average) compared with 2013 (plant products -9.4% and animal products +0.5%). In the same period, prices paid for goods currently consumed decreased by 3.2%. The Consumer Price Index of food and non-alcoholic beverages fell by 0.3% in 2014.

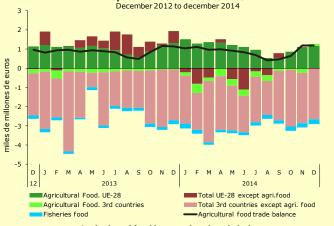

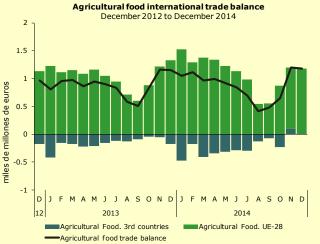

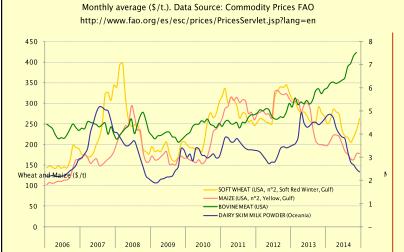

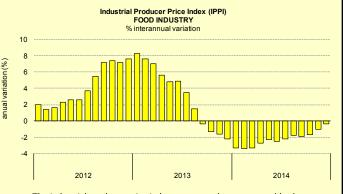
Total purchases of goods and services: Value of all goods and services purchased during the accounting period for resale or consumption in the production process, excluding capital goods (the consumption of which is registered as consumption of fixed capital).

Operating expenditure or expenses: Is the sum of all current expenditure relating to operating activities. It is made up of raw materials and consumables, other external charges, staff costs, value adjustments in respect of formation expenses and of tangible and intangible fixed assets, value adjustments in respect of current assets, other operating charges.

The operating surplus (Profit or Loss) of an enterprise measures the difference between revenue and expenditure i.e. the surplus or deficit - accruing from production. It is calculated before taking account of any interest, rent or similar charges payable on financial or tangible non-produced assets borrowed or rented by the enterprise, or any interest, rent or similar receipts receivable on financial or tangible non-produced assets owned by the enterprise.

Forestry & Logging employed 24,800 people in 2014 (+6.1% with respect to 2013), Manufacture of Wood and Cork, 51,400 people (-2.2%), and Paper manufacturing industry, 45,500 people (+2.5%).
