Analysis:

Spain in the international agricultural trade

Spain reached the 8th position in the international ranking of agricultural exporting countries, with a total value of 34,932 million euro in 2011 (source: World Trade Organization, WTO). According to the WTO, the Spanish balance of agricultural trade was 2,745 million euro in 2011, having increased by 323% between 2007 and 2011. Spain was the second country in the world with the highest growth, only preceded by the USA, with 65%.

The 10 first products exported by Spain (citrus fruits, wine, pig meat, olive oil or fresh vegetables, between others) accounted in 2011 for the 39,4% of Spanish total agricultural export value and experienced an average increase of 23% between 2007 and 2011.

Spain competes with Germany in pig meat exports, with France and Italy in wine, and with Italy in olive oil. Nevertheless, Spain accounts for many other products that are not so important in the export portfolio of its competitors, such as citrus fruits, strawberries, frozen fish, canned vegetables or stone fruits.

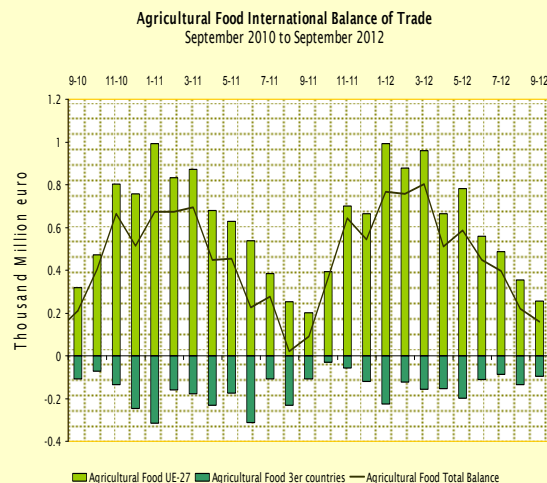

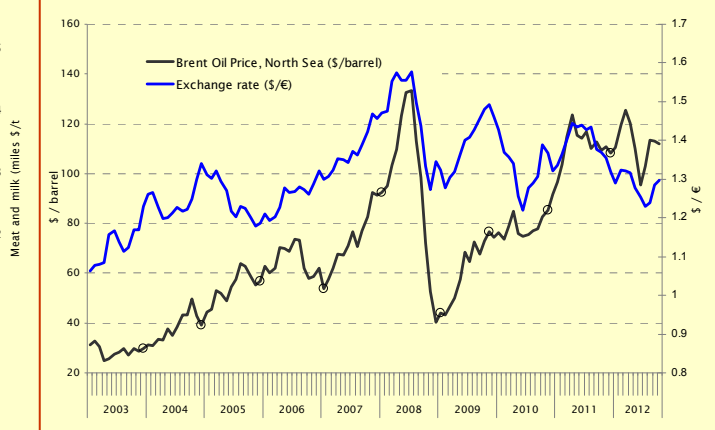
